

### **About the Action Research Fund**



- Better Security, Better Care has launched a new research grant fund
- To identify and test new approaches in cyber and data security for Adult Social Care
- Awarding grants to original pilot or 'discovery' research projects
- Up to a maximum of £15,000 for each research project
- Evaluation to determine those viable for further investment

#### Policy paper

A cyber resilient health and adult social care system in England: cyber security strategy to 2030

#### **Five Pillars:**

- 1. Focus on the greatest risks and harms
- 2. Defend as one
- 3. People and culture
- 4. Build secure for the future
- 5. Exemplary response and recovery



## Pillars explained



- 1. Focus on the greatest risks and harms
  - Critical parts of the system where disruption would cause the greatest harm
  - Highest risks are proportionately protected

#### 2. Defend as one

- Partnerships with Health to improve sector-wide resilience
- Leverage capability, technologies and scale
- Collaboration on cyber security, sharing data, learning and resources

#### 3. People and culture

- Staff are equipped with skills and resources to combat cyber threat
- Developing a 'just culture' staff are supported to be open about mistakes



## Pillars explained



#### 4. Build secure for the future

- Engaging early with emerging technology
- Setting standards for how tech is built and implemented across ASC
- Build a more secure system, with cyber security at the fore

#### 5. Exemplary response and recovery

- Minimise impact of a cyber incident and recovery time
- Partnerships and innovative approaches with the cyber sector
- Focus on business continuity
